When you arrive at the airport **terminal**, take your **baggage / luggage**, ticket, and identification to the **check-in**. **Passengers** who only have a **carry-on baggage** can also check in online or on computers at the airport. Then, proceed through **security** to the **boarding gate**. Check the information boards to know if your **flight** is **delayed** or how long of a **layover** you may have. As you **board your plane**, a member of the **cabin crew** will check your **boarding pass** and direct you to the correct **aisle** and seat. When you arrive at your destination, pick up your luggage from the **carousel**. If your flight was international, you will have to go through **customs** and **passport control**. If you have crossed several **time zones**, you may or may not suffer from **jetlag** when you arrive.
