Must and have to both expresses obligation.

However, they are used differently depending on **who** imposes the obligation.

The **speaker** thinks it is necessary.

I **must** buy flowers for my mother.

(It's her birthday and I decide to do that.)

"You **must** take more exercise" says the doctor.

(The doctor thinks it is necessary.)

I **must** ask my secretary to book a flight for me.

(It is important **for me** not to forget.)

## **HAVE TO**

**Someone else** thinks it is necessary.

I **have to** buy flowers for my mother-in-law.

(It is not my decision - my husband asked me to do it.)

I have to take more exercise.

(The doctor says it is necessary.)

I have to call the travel agency.

(My boss asked me to book a flight.)
