With

Used to indicate being together or being involved:

- I ordered a sandwich with a drink.
- He was with his friend when he saw me.
- She has been working with her sister at the nail shop.
- The manager will be with you shortly.

Used to indicate "having":

- I met a guy with green eyes.
- Were you the one talking with an accent?
- People with a lot of money are not always happy.

Used to indicate "using":

- I wrote a letter with the pen you gave me.
- This is the soup that I made with rice and barley.
- He cut my hair with his gold scissors.
