come out- to appear, to be seen.

The newspaper comes out every Monday through Friday.

The moon came out last night.

come around- to change one's mind, to change one's opinion, agree.

My son doesn't want to study in New Zealand, but I think he will come around to the idea if he thinks about it for a while.

come down on- to scold or punish.

Our boss really came down on us after we made that mistake.

come up with- to produce or supply.

I didn't think Joe had any money but suddenly he came up with enough to buy a car.

come to (someone)- remember or recall.

I didn't remember who she was and suddenly it came to me. We went to high school together.

come about- to happen.

You became the mayor of your city? Wow! How did that come about?
