

## Phrasal Verbs with Come

---

**come out-** to appear, to be seen.

*The newspaper comes out every Monday through Friday.*

*The moon came out last night.*

**come around-** to change one's mind, to change one's opinion, agree.

*My son doesn't want to study in New Zealand, but I think he will come around to the idea if he thinks about it for a while.*

**come down on-** to scold or punish.

*Our boss really came down on us after we made that mistake.*

**come up with-** to produce or supply.

*I didn't think Joe had any money but suddenly he came up with enough to buy a car.*

**come to (someone)-** remember or recall.

*I didn't remember who she was and suddenly it came to me. We went to high school together.*

**come about-** to happen.

*You became the mayor of your city? Wow! How did that come about?*
