II. GRAMMAR REVIEW:

Topic: Wrong Article with General Count Noun

An article should precede a **count noun** in the general sense unless the **noun** is plural.

PROBLEM : The wrong **article**, or **no article**, may be used with a **count noun** in the general sense.

SOLUTION : Remove the **article** if the **noun** is plural. Change the **article** to **a** or **an** if the **noun** is a singular count noun.

EXAMPLES

Incorrect : **Animal** eats living things briskly.

Correct : **An animal** eats living things briskly.

Correct : **Animals** eat living things briskly.

Explanation : **Animal** is a count noun used in a generic sense. Use a with the singular form (an animal) or no article with the plural form (animals).

	Count noun	v	n	Adv
Generic	Animals	eat	living things	briskly.

Incorrect : **The Vases** add beauty to a room.

Correct : **Vases** add beauty to a room.

Explanation : **Vase** is a count noun used here in a generic sense. Use no article with the plural form (*vases*).

	Count noun	v	n	Prep phrase
Generic	Vases	add	beauty	to a room.
