Before you decide to **accept a job offer**, you should carefully read the small print of the contract of employment if the employer provides one. The contract is an official legal agreement that defines various **terms and conditions** that both employer and employee must follow. These will include such things as the amount of **vacation time** you are **entitled to per annum /year** or how much paid **sick leave** you can take off of work. It may also state **regulations** about taking a leave of **absence** for events such as **maternity / paternity leave**. An important condition concerns how much **notice** you have to give if you want to **quit** your job, in other words **terminate your contract**. The contract will also mention how many days **notice** the employer has to give you if they are going to **fire** you because they no longer need you, as well as state how your employer can **lay** you **off** if you are guilty of **misconduct**. The contract of employment will also state a number of other **company regulations** that you must understand and agree to when you **sign**.
