Grammar

Sometimes a question is within a sentence or another question. This question is called an embedded question. We often use embedded questions as a polite way of asking a question. *I haven't found out whether the bank will grant my loan or not.*

Could you tell me what you're thinking about?

1 Embedded *Wh*-questions

An embedded *Wh*- question uses the same word order as a statement, not a question. This means that the subject goes before the verb.

Question	Embedded question
What did the client want?	I wonder what the client wanted.
When does Moira's flight arrive?	Do you know when Moiras flight arrives?
Where will the election be held?	I don't know where the election will be held.
Why hasn't Izzy locked the door?	Can you tell me why Izzy hasn't locked the door?
Who is Alberto inviting?	I wonder who Alberto is inviting.
How many DVDs did you sell?	I don't remember how many DVDs you sold.
How much is the machine	Could you tell me how much the machine is?
How should we handle this issue?	Do you have any idea how we should handle this issue?
Whose bike can I take?	I would like to know whose bike I can take.
