

## Non-action verbs or stative verbs

Some verbs in English do not use present progressive even though the meaning is in progress, and these are the non-action verbs.

**Non-action verbs** indicate sense, desire, possession, opinion, and information in your brain.

A. Present Progressive tense is when an action is currently in progress.



1. The students **are sitting** in class.
2. The students **are raising** their hands.
3. The students **know** the answer.  
We don't say, "The students **are knowing** the answer."

### Examples of action verbs:

jump  
run  
eat

smile  
hit
