Prepositions: Since and For

Since

Since is used to give the starting point of actions or events that continue up to the moment of speaking. It is a point in time (June, 1976, etc.)

Example:

We haven't seen him since his birthday. We haven't played soccer since May.



For

We use 'for' to talk about a period of time continuing up to the present. It is used with length of time (e.g. four years, two months)

Example:

Ken has studied English for two months. Barnie hasn't come to school for two days.
