Topic: Unspecified Count Noun without THE.

A count noun is a noun that is distinct and can be counted. It can be both singular and plural in form. Often, articles are used to show whether a noun is specified or unspecified. For unspecified count nouns, the articles "a" or "an" are used.

"a": used if the first letter of the count noun is a consonant. (ex. a bag, a school)
"an": used if the first letter of the count noun is a vowel. (ex. an egg, an ambassador)

Remember: For unspecified singular count nouns, use articles "a" or "an". For unspecified plural count nouns (meaning "all" or "in general"), do not use any articles.

Examples:

Unspecified Singular Count Nouns

| Article | Count Noun | |
|---------|------------|----------------------------|
| A | dog | is walking to the park. |
| An | egg | was served in the morning. |

Unspecified Plural Count

| Article | Count Noun | |
|--------------|------------|-----------------------------|
| (no article) | Dogs | are walking to the park. |
| (no article) | Eggs | were served in the morning. |
