PROBLEM : An article may be used with a generic non-count noun.

SOLUTION: Remove the article if the noun is non-count.

EXAMPLES:

Incorrect : A homework makes students review the lesson.

Correct : Homework makes students review the lesson.

Explanation: Homework is a non-count noun used in a generic sense. Do not use

an article.

Incorrect : Fast copiers increase the efficiency. Both of us desire the happiness.

Correct : Both of us desire happiness.

Explanation: Happiness is a non-count noun used in a generic sense. Do not use
